An academic program where you participate in **experiential learning** placements as part of your course!

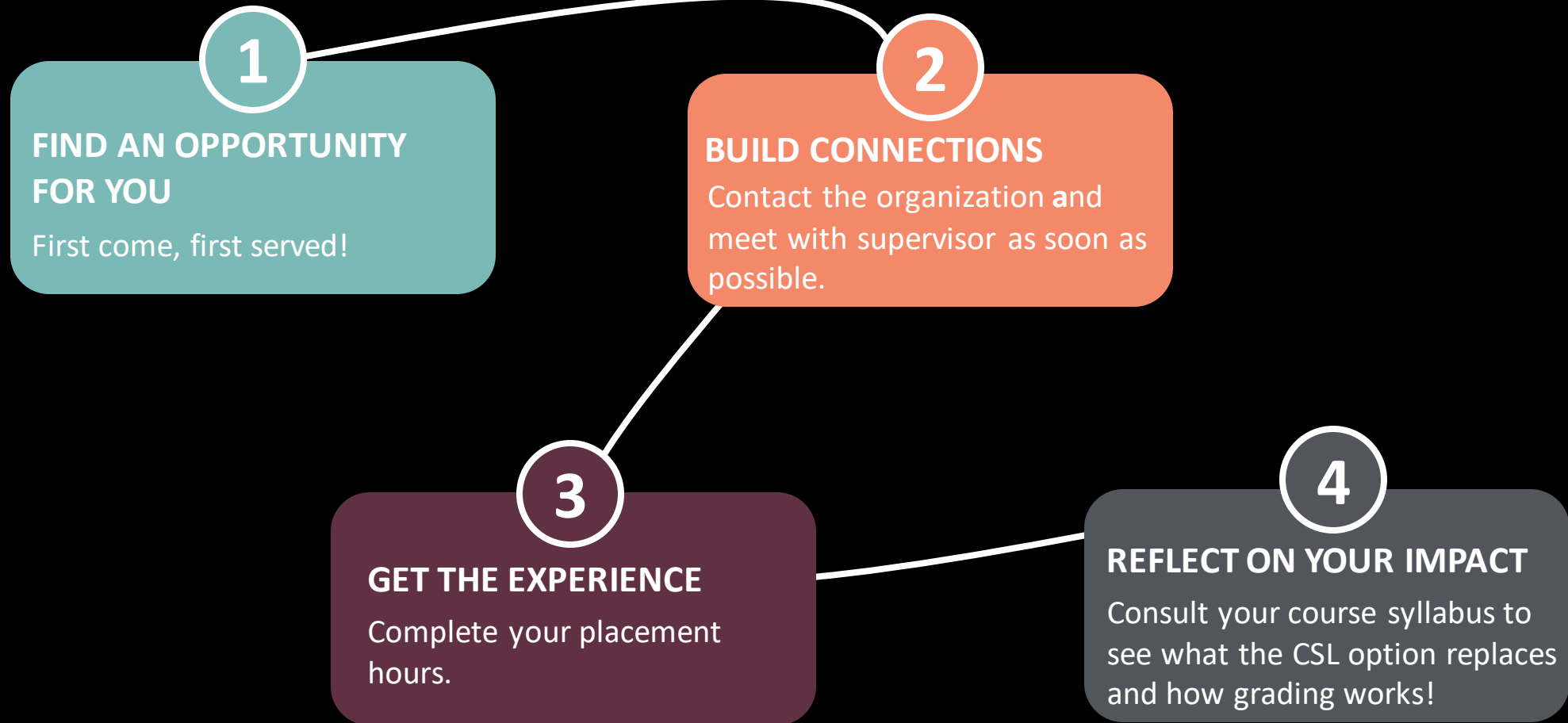




# ADVANTAGES

## "Science communication through outreach to children and youth (in-person)"

- Let's Talk Science at uOttawa is a science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) volunteer outreach organization. The past year we reached over 90,000 children and youth.
- We bring our engaging hands-on, minds-on activities to schools and community events.
- Most of our activities are done during the week, during elementary and high school hours (e.g. 8:30-1:30 p.m.), you will have to have time in your schedule during these hours. We will provide you with a list of activities needing volunteers, and it will be your responsibility to choose enough activities to fill the hours.
- Read carefully the placement! There are other requirements listed in the description of the placement.

# POLICE RECORD CHECK



*Let's Talk Science: "If you work with our Black Youth in STEM Club or our Indigenous partners, you will need a criminal record check and we will provide you with a letter so you can get the check at no cost."*

**If you do not already have an active sector check, we recommend you consider the potential wait time to receive one.**

- ▶ Residents of Ottawa and the surrounding area: Ottawa Police Services. Online or in person. There is a fee. (Please note: the wait for an application in person can be 7 to 8 weeks.)
- ▶ Residents outside of Ottawa: Please apply to your local police department.
